REACH EU COMPLIANCE

Andreae Filters and Floor Paper are compliant with standards set forth by the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA). Neither handling nor disposal of Andreae Products results in human or environmental exposure of hazardous or toxic substances.* As such, no registration nor notification obligation is required under the requirements set forth in the regulation for Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH) legislation.

Article 7

2. Any producer or importer of articles shall notify the Agency, in accordance with paragraph 4 of this Article, if a substance meets the criteria in Article 57 and is identified in accordance with Article 59(1), if both the following conditions are met:
 - a) the substance is present in those articles in quantities totaling over one tonne per producer or importer per year;
 - b) the substance is present in those articles above a concentration of 0.1% weight by weight (w/w).
3. Paragraph 2 shall not apply where the producer or importer can exclude exposure to humans or the environment during normal or reasonably foreseeable conditions of use including disposal. In such cases, the producer or importer shall supply appropriate instructions to the recipient of the article.

Andreae Filters and Floor Paper do not contain substances identified in Annex XIII and XVII. No known toxic or hazardous substances are used in the production of the aforementioned articles.

The Guidance on Requirements for Substances in Articles states that notification and communication obligations apply to substances identified on the Candidate List of Substances of Very High Concern for Authorization. The properties of these substances are defined in Article 57: carcinogenic, mutagenic or toxic to reproduction (CMRs category 1 & 2), persistent, bioaccumulative and toxic (PBT) or very persistent and very bioaccumulative (vPvB), or for which there is evidence for similar concern.

* Does not apply to toxic and hazardous particles collected by the paint arrestor. Loaded overspray collectors must be disposed of in the same manner as any paint-laden waste material.
